The injunction not to fear is one of the most oft repeated in scripture. The stories of our old and new testament come from people who endured a lot of oppression and hardship and continually their prophets offered words of comfort from God, promising not only redemption from their suffering, but a compassionate and steadfast presence throughout their affliction. God gave us the final evidence of God's commitment to be present to us in suffering when Jesus endured crucifixion at Calvary. We do not worship a God who is indifferent and distant. We worship a God who knows us intimately and shares our every breath with us. That God promises to accompany us wherever we go and whatever we encounter.

Consider using this time of relative solitude to reconnect with God through prayer or meditation. Reconnect with your immediate family. Enjoy the quiet and the gifts it brings and turn off the minute by minute news updates which won't do anything but needlessly raise your blood pressure.

Outside my window right now my plum tree is in bloom and bees are busily going about their work pollenating the blossoms. Just a couple days ago it was covered in snow. Nature continues to show us her wonders, and do her steady work of bringing new life, even as many other things seem in turmoil.
