Remembering the Hartleys

In May, a photo was posted to Face-book showing the rear of an overloaded pickup, bikes strapped on, traveling north over the I-5 Columbia bridge; the Hartleys were moving to Seattle where Laura had accepted a position as Provost at Seattle Pacific University. Their family had been very active in our little church for the past 7 or 8 years. Several months have passed, we've had church services on ZOOM, we've had four combined outdoor services for Mountain Home and Sherwood. As time passed, I have reflected upon their family and how we'll miss them.

As Deacon, <u>Ben</u> preached and shared his knowledge of church history; he also reminded us of our historical roots in the Methodist Church; his passion for the subject matter and for teaching it was very obvious. He was a role model for outreach, often visiting disenfranchised people; he worked with

MacLaren young men and the church had a Christmas outreach party with them that year. Working with several other members he helped to launch the Bicycle Rest Stop which provides much needed water for bicyclers; in addition, people walking their dogs are able to stop, rest and give their animal water.

One of Laura's many strengths was her musical talent; she was an alto in the choir (unless Linda asked her to sing a different part) and the other altos followed her lead. Often she provided assistance with timing in a song. She was a respected leader of the church, acting in roles of leadership in Church Council chair and as Lay Leader. She was always the go-to expert to answer questions of faith. She was an integral part of the women's book club. She led the group who worked with George Fox students to design and implement a brand for Mountain Home UMC; the result was a brand (or logo) for any paper used for the church's purpose, a brand for our web site and a branded design for our Facebook page. Laura said one of the best parts of belonging to our church was that she could just be Laura, not the Dean.
