

Join Us Outdoors This Summer!!

Friends of Sherwood and Mountain Home United Methodist Churches, you are invited to join us for outdoor worship during the months of June, July, and August. Our joint reimagining team, in consultation with the Cascadia District, and following the most updated guidance from the CDC and local regulations has made a plan for worship that will enable us to meet in person outdoors.

Recognizing that we have some children, and some immuno-compromised members who are unable to be vaccinated, and desiring to be the safest and most welcoming community we can be, we ask everyone who joins us in worship to continue to observe social distancing guidelines (6' distance between households), and to wear a mask at all times. We are aware that recent CDC advice allows for vaccinated people to go unmasked outdoors, but there are several reasons we are going to continue using masks together for the time being:

- As mentioned not all of our members can be vaccinated at this time and it is all of our duty to help protect the vulnerable in our midst.
- In order to create a welcoming atmosphere for all we are not going to institute a policy of checking vaccination status in order to worship.
- Using masks enables us to engage in congregational singing, which would otherwise be a high risk activity. We are ready to sing together again!!

In the event that weather does not cooperate with us hosting an outdoor service on a given Sunday our rainy day plan will be to return to using Zoom as our online alternative. The decision whether to cancel for weather will be made by 8am on the day of, so watch your email inbox if clouds are looming. To help reach as many people in our community as possible all outdoor services will be recorded and posted to our church Youtube by Monday. We will continue to send out a weekly email with links and prayer requests so that all who cannot attend in person may continue to participate virtually.

Thank you to everyone who has helped to keep our community connected during this difficult year. See you outdoors this summer!!
