## **Vibrating Together** This summer we have been able to worship together outdoors, and crucially, to sing together. This has been possible due to the combination of widespread vaccination making the risk of contracting or transmitting Covid-19

much lower, and increasing evidence that transmission outdoors is unlikely, particularly when other mitigation measures, such as masking and distancing, are employed as we have been doing.

Making music together is incredibly important in the Methodist tradition, and goes back to the earliest gatherings of Christians. Some of the very first texts we have from Christian communities are sacred songs. Paul's letters are full of quotations and references to hymns. Christians, like the Jewish communities which they emerged among, used music abundantly in their worship and communal life.

There is undeniably something special about singing together. When we sing, we sustain the sound so the physical air vibrates in concert with the efforts of our neighbors. We consciously

and intentionally strive to match our rhythms, our pitch, and our volume. We get in tune with one another, literally AND metaphorically, and the evidence of our unity is audible around us. It is a unique way of making the spiritual tangible. Our joined voices manifest, both in our words, and in our harmonies, our spiritual intentions. It's miraculous.

The collective manipulation of sound waves vibrating through the air mirrors another subtler resonance that happens when we are together in a group. As with many animals, when we are in physical proximity to each other, our limbic systems, the parts of our brains that regulate emotions and memory begin to communicate. This communication is subtle and mostly invisible, but you can recognize it in people's behavior. The longer we're together the more we mirror each other. When you tilt your head, so do I. When you open your posture, I do also. As my breathing becomes slower and more relaxed, so too does yours. A million hidden signals, some pheromonal, others

electrical, still others visual or auditory, regulate the processes in our bodies that make us feel calm and safe. We begin to move on the same frequency. This time of pandemic has taught us many lessons. One of them is this: there is simply no replacement for time spent in one another's presence vibrating together.
