



I'm thinking about breaking ground and groundbreaking.

I recently joined leaders from Central Oregon to break ground on an exciting

> new food bank facility in Redmond. Johnson Bill from the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs blessed the ground with drum and song. We each got a shovel and ceremonially moved a bit of earth.

I thought about the very first documented groundbreaking ceremony in China in 113 BCE – and how our human desire to honor the land, mark new beginnings and seek strong foundations crosses time, space and cultures.

NeighborImpact is the outstanding Community Action Agency that owns and operates the current food bank in Redmond – and the one that is about to be built. NeighborImpact says it was "created in 1985 to represent and serve economically disadvantaged residents of Deschutes, Crook, and Jefferson counties and the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs." With a mission "to support people and strengthen communities," NeighborImpact is one vital node of the broader Oregon Food Bank Network. Our human desire to work collaboratively and support one another in times of need also crosses time, space and cultures.

And while I was literally breaking ground in Redmond, a groundbreaking legislative campaign led by Oregon Food Bank, Partners for a Hunger-Free Oregon and more than 70 incredible allies was getting fully underway.

Once the legislation is successfully enacted, Food for All Oregonians will ensure that where we were born is not a barrier to nutrition assistance. For the first time in Oregon's history, all our low-income neighbors will have access to food safety net benefits.

That will be a glorious new foundation for us to build on. Because our human desire to build a better world for our children and grandchildren crosses time, space and cultures, too.
